**The Constitution of Sierra Leone (Amendment)
Act, 1981**

Short title.

Being an Act to amend the Constitution of Sierra Leone, so as to harmonize it with the Constitution of the All People's Congress; and for connected purposes.

[19th November, 1981] Date of Commencement.

BE IT ENACTED by the President and Members of Parliament in this present Parliament assembled as follows:—

Amendment
of Section
38 (5) of
the Consti-
tution.

1. Subsection (5) of Section 38 of the Constitution of Sierra Leone is hereby amended by the deletion of the word "two" appearing in the first and eighth lines thereof, and the substitution therefor of the word "three".

Amendment
of Section
45 (1) (b) of
the Consti-
tution.

2. Subsection (1) of Section 45 of the Constitution of Sierra Leone is hereby amended by the repealing and replacing of paragraph (b) thereof by the following new paragraph (b)—

"(b) if he is a member of any Commission established under this Constitution, or a member of the armed forces of the Republic or has been such member within twelve months prior to the date on which he seeks to be elected, or if he is a public officer, an employee of a public corporation as defined in subsection (2) of Section 137 of the Constitution, a teacher or lecturer in a Government school or institution or a Government assisted school or institution, or has been such officer, employee, teacher, or lecturer, and has not resigned or retired at least three months prior to the date on which he seeks to be elected; or"

Passed in Parliament this 9th day of *November*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-one.
