The 1989/90 Supplementary Appropriation Act, 1990

Short title.

Being an Act to make Supplementary Provision for the Service of
Sierra Leone for the Year 1989/90

[3rd January, 1990] Date of commencement.

WHEREAS by the 1989/90 Appropriation Act, 1989 a sum not exceeding four billion, two hundred and eleven million and sixty three thousand, seven hundred and thirty four leones was provided for the service of Sierra Leone for the year nineteen hundred and eighty nine to ninety:

Act No. 3 of 1989.

Le2,030,505,809.

AND WHEREAS it has become necessary to provide for the expenditure from the Consolidated Fund a further sum of two billion and thirty million, five hundred and five thousand, eight hundred and nine leones in excess of the provisions contained in the 1989/90 Appropriation Act, 1989, for the several services set out in the Schedule hereto:

Act No. 2 of 1961.

AND WHEREAS section 14 of the Finance (Control and Management) Act, 1961 provides that any proposals for such expenditure be submitted to a vote of Parliament by means of a Supplementary Appropriation Bill which shall contain that expenditure under appropriate Heads:

Commencement

NOW BE IT ENACTED by the President and Members of Parliament in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Le2,030,505,809.

1. This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 3rd day of January, 1990.

Le2,030,505,809.

2. The sum of two billion and thirty million, five hundred and five thousand, eight hundred and nine leones shall be and is hereby granted to His Excellency the President for and during the year nineteen hundred and eighty-nine to ninety to be applied for the several services set out in the Schedule.

Accountant-General's authority to pay.

3. The said sum of two billion and thirty million, five hundred and five thousand, eight hundred and nine leones shall be and is hereby declared to be charged upon and made payable from and out of the Consolidated Fund for the year nineteen hundred and eighty nine to ninety and the payment thereof shall be taken to begin immediately after the commencement of this Act.

Balance at 30th June, 1990 to lapse.

4. The Accountant-General is hereby authorised and required from time to time upon the warrant or order of the Minister of Finance to pay out of the Consolidated Fund the sum of two billion and thirty million, five hundred and five thousand, eight hundred and nine leones for the services specified in the Schedule.

5. The amount from time to time paid for and in respect of the expenditure authorised in section 2 shall not exceed in gross the sum of two billion and thirty million, five hundred and five thousand, eight hundred and nine leones during the year ending on the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and ninety and any balance remaining unissued at the end of June nineteen hundred and ninety shall lapse and shall not be available for making payment in the following years.
