**The National Assets and Government's Property
Commission Act, 1990**

Short title.

Being an Act to establish a National Assets and Government's Property Commission and a National Assets Register; to make provision for the control and identification of all National Assets and Government's Property; to provide for the maintenance and improvement of such property and the monitoring of their use or disposal; and for connected purposes

[1st August 1991] Date of Commencement.

BE IT ENACTED by the President and Members of Parliament in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1. This Act shall come into operation on such date as the President may by Order in the *Gazette* appoint. Commencement.

Interpretation.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Chairman” means the person appointed to be Chairman under section 3 and any temporary Chairman so appointed;

“Commission” means the National Assets and Government's Property Commission established under section 3;

“Commissioner” means any member of the Commission established under section 3;

“Consolidated Fund” means the Revenue Fund set up under section 127 of the Constitution of Sierra Leone, 1978;

“Government's property” includes real estate and any interest therein, choses in action, stocks, shares and debentures, vehicles, equipment, furniture or other immovable or moveable property belonging to the Government, or provided for the use of any Government establishment, service or Department.

“Master Register” means the Register established under paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section 5;

“National Asset” includes all real estate or any interest therein, or hereditaments belonging to the Government or provided for the use of any Government establishment, service or Department.

Establishment and Constitution of the National Assets and Government's Property Commission.

3. (1) There is hereby established a Commission to be known as The National Assets and Government's Property Commission which shall be directly under the Office of the President.

(2) The Commission shall consist of the following who shall be appointed by the President and shall be known as National Assets Commissioners—

- (a) a Chairman;
- (b) the Inspector-General of Police or his representative;
- (c) the Secretary to the President or his representative;
- (d) a Law Officer;
- (e) one member who is a Licensed Surveyor;
- (f) one member representing the Building and Construction Industry;

- (g) one member representing the Institution of Engineers;
- (h) one member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants;
- (i) one member who is an automobile engineer;
- (i) a representative of the Bar Association;
- (k) three ordinary Members of Parliament;
- (l) a representative each from the Western Area and the three Provinces.

4. (1) Any person appointed to be a Commissioner shall be appointed for a period of three years and such person shall be eligible for re-appointment.

Conditions and tenure of office of Commissioners.

(2) Any person appointed to be a Commissioner shall be subject to such conditions as may be determined by the President.

(3) Any member of the Commission may resign his office by giving at least three months' notice to the President. The member resigning shall also send a copy of such notice to the Chairman of the Commission.

(4) The President may revoke the appointment of any member of the Commission.

5. (1) The Commission shall—

- (a) establish and maintain a National Register of all national assets and Government's property to be known as the Master Register which shall contain a list of all national assets;
- (b) serve as the custodian of the Master Register;
- (c) report on the allocation and use of various assets;
- (d) review and revise the Master Register of national assets as and when necessary in collaboration with the relevant Ministries or Departments;
- (e) monitor and report on the state of various national assets and Government's property to the President together with appropriate recommendations.

Duties and functions of the Commission—The National Register.

(2) The Commission shall be informed of the acquisition and holding of any national asset or Government's property by the agency or Government department concerned.

(3) No disposal of any national asset or Government's property shall take place without prior consultation with the Commission.

Commission to make annual report.

6. (1) The Commission shall make an annual report on the state of the national assets and Government's property in the Master Register, which report shall be laid before Parliament.

(2) The Master Register shall be opened to the Public for inspection.

Power of the Commission.

7. Subject to any powers exercisable by any Ministry or Department, the Commission may—

- (a) receive and consider any information or proposal for identifying or improving any national asset or Government's property;
- (b) receive and consider any information on the misuse, abuse or disposal of Government's property without lawful authority;
- (c) undertake the examination from time to time of national assets and Government's property and make recommendations to the President for their improvement or security;
- (d) in consultation with the Attorney-General and Minister of Justice and the Police, take any appropriate action to stop, check or recover any national asset or Government's property being willfully or maliciously misused, abused or misappropriated;
- (e) appoint or co-opt committees or sub-committees, whether from among members of the Commission or from among persons outside the Commission, to study in detail and make recommendations to the Commission on any aspect of national assets or Government's property on which such persons may have specialised or expert knowledge.

Power of Commission to summon and examine.

8. The Commission may summon and examine any person, with a view to making inquiries into any information the Commission may have received regarding the national assets or Government's property, or any investigation it may have carried out.

9. (1) There shall be established a Secretariat which shall consist of a Secretary and such staff and facilities as the Commission may require. Establishment of Secretariat.

(2) The Secretary to the Commission shall be appointed by the President. Secretary, administrative officers and support-
ing staff of the Commission.

(3) The Secretary to the Commission shall be the administrative head of the Secretariat established under subsection (1) and shall be assisted in the discharge of his duties by such other persons as shall be appointed to the Secretariat.

(4) The Secretary to the Commission and the staff of the Secretariat shall be full time public officers.

(5) The Secretariat may employ such supporting staff as may be required.

10. (1) The salary and remuneration of the Chairmen and members shall be determined by the President. Salary of Chairman remuneration and expenses of the Commission.

(2) There shall be paid to the members of the Commission and such persons as may be appointed to serve in committees and sub-committees as provided for under paragraph (e) of section 7 who are not Commissioners, such salaries or remuneration as may be determined by the President.

(3) The salaries or remuneration of the Commissioners and the expenses of the Commission, including the salaries or remuneration of employees of the Commission and the staff of the Secretariat, shall be a charge upon the Consolidated Fund.

11. (1) In addition to the Master Register to be established and maintained under section 5 of this Act, the Secretary to the Commission shall establish and maintain— Register and other records and accounts of the Commission.

(a) a register containing the names and addresses of all members of the Commission, including employees of the Commission and the Secretariat;

(b) a minute book recording the minutes of any sittings or meetings of the Commission;

(c) proper books of Accounts;

(d) proper records of the work and activities and findings of the Commission including any report it may have received from members of the public;
