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THE CUSTOMS TARIFF ACT, 1978
(Act No. 16 of 1978)

THE CUSTOMS TARIFF (AMENDMENT) (No.) ORDER, 1982 Short title.

In exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 10 of the Customs Tariff Act, 1978 the Minister of Finance acting in accordance with the advice of the Cabinet hereby makes the following Order:—


1. The Second Schedule to the Customs Tariff Act is hereby amended by adding the following new items 100.14 and 100.15

“100.14 Unprocessed Products as listed in Appendix III originating in Countries belonging to the Economic Community of West African States.”

“100.15 Traditional Handicraft as listed in Appendix IV originating in Countries belonging to the Economic of West African States.”
