The Ports (Amendment) Act, 1984

Short title.

Being an Act to amend the Ports Act, 1964

(Act No. 56 of 1964)

[21st August, 1984.] Date of commencement.

BE IT ENACTED by the President and Members of Parliament in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1. Section 49 of the Ports Act, 1964 (Act No. 56 of 1964) is hereby amended by the substitution for subsection (2) thereof of the following new subsection —

“(2) The Authority may prescribe as a penalty for the breach of any bye-law made under this section, any fine

not exceeding one thousand leones or any term of imprisonment not exceeding twelve months or both; and where the breach is a continuous one, a further fine not exceeding twenty leones for every day after the first day during which the breach continues.”

2. For section 103 of the principal Act there is hereby substituted the following new section—

“Boarding
ships
without
permission.

103 (1) Any person who—

(a) not being duly authorised by law for the purpose goes on board any ship within a port without the permission of the master, agent or owner of the ship, or

(b) having been required to leave such ship by the master refuses to do so,

shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on summary conviction, be liable to a fine not exceeding two hundred leones or a term of imprisonment not exceeding three months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

(2) The Master of any ship referred to in subsection (1) of this section may take any such person going on board or refusing to leave as described in that subsection, into custody and deliver him forthwith to any constable to be conveyed to a police station to be dealt with according to law.”

Passed in Parliament this 7th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-four.
