THE LIQUOR (AMENDMENT) RULES, 1976

In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Liquor Act the President, acting in accordance with the advice of the Cabinet, hereby makes the following Rules:—

1. Paragraph (2) of Rule 2 of the Liquor Rules is hereby amended by the substitution for the expression "three years" appearing in line 3 of item (2) thereof, of the expression "two years".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Rules but is intended to indicate their general purport).

The purpose of the amendment to these Rules is to change the period of aging of Rum from three years to two years in order to conform to International practice and so avoid the risk of loss of revenue which may result from prohibiting the importation of rum stored for the two-year period.
