The Exchange Control (Amendment) Act, 1966

Short title.

Being An Act to Permit Certain Gold Coins issued in Commemoration
of Independence to be Bought, Sold, Borrowed, Lent, Returned
Used or Exported Freely and unconditionally by
All Persons

[26th April, 1966.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and
with the advice and consent of the House of Representatives in
this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:—

1. This Act shall come into operation on the 26th day of
April, 1966.

2. The Exchange Control Act is hereby amended by the addition at the end thereof of the following new section—

“Sale etc. of
certain gold
coins.

45. Notwithstanding anything contained in any of the preceding provisions of this Act any person who soever may freely and unconditionally buy, sell, borrow, lend, retain, use or export from Sierra Leone any of the gold coins hereunder specified.

Denomination

50 leone piece	(one golde)
25 leone piece	(half golde)
12½ leone piece	(quarter golde).”.
