**An Act to provide for the Service of Sierra Leone
 for the year 1964-65**

[*1st April, 1964.*] Date of

WHEREAS it is necessary to make provision for the service of
 Sierra Leone for the year 1964-65:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent
 Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Repre-
 sentatives in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority
 of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the 1964-65 Appropriation Act, Short title
 1964, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the and com-
 1st day of April, 1964. mence-
 ment.

2. The sum of sixteen million, one hundred and eighty-five thousand, seven hundred and forty-two pounds shall be and is hereby granted to Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors for and during the year nineteen hundred and sixty-four/sixty-five and the same shall be applied and expended in the manner herein described and for the several services set forth in the First and Second Schedules.

3. The said sum of sixteen million, one hundred and eighty-five thousand, seven hundred and forty-two pounds shall be and is hereby declared to be charged upon and made payable from and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the year nineteen hundred and sixty-four/sixty-five and the payment thereof shall be taken to begin and commence on and immediately after the first day of April, nineteen hundred and sixty-four.

4. The Accountant-General is hereby authorised and required from time to time, upon the Warrant or Order of the Minister of Finance, to pay out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the several services specified in the First and Second Schedules the sum of sixteen million, one hundred and eighty-five thousand, seven hundred and forty-two pounds which will come in course of payment during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March, nineteen hundred and sixty-five.

5. The amount from time to time paid for and in respect of the expenditure authorised in section 2 shall not exceed in the gross the sum of sixteen million, one hundred and eighty-five thousand, seven hundred and forty-two pounds from the first day of April, nineteen hundred and sixty-four inclusive, and any balances remaining unissued at the end of March nineteen hundred and sixty-five shall lapse and not be available for making payments in the following year.
