Pensions (Mr. S. L. Bangura) Act, 1966

Short title.

Being an Act to Make Special Provision for the Pension of Samuel Lansana Bangura an Administrative Officer in the Public Service of Sierra Leone

Date of commencement.

[21st July, 1966.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Representatives in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act shall be read as one with the Pensions Act (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act).

2. (1) In the event of Samuel Lansana Bangura an Administrative Officer resigning from the public service before the 7th day of June, 1971, in order to take office as Deputy Governor of the Bank of Sierra Leone, it shall be lawful for the Governor-General, notwithstanding any of the provisions of the principal Act or Rules made under section 3 thereof, to grant to the said Samuel Lansana Bangura upon ceasing to be employed by the Bank of Sierra Leone (otherwise than on dismissal for misconduct) on or after the 1st day of June, 1971, or prior to that date for reasons of ill health in circumstances comparable to those described in subsection (6) of section 7 of the principal Act, a pension, or gratuity and reduced pension according to a scale agreed upon between the Minister of Finance and the Governor of the Bank of Sierra Leone.

(2) A pension, or gratuity and reduced pension granted under this section shall be in place of any pension or gratuity and reduced pension which may be granted to the said Samuel Lansana Bangura under the principal Act and shall be deemed for all purposes to be a pension or gratuity and reduced pension granted thereunder.
