**An Act to Make Supplementary Provision for the
Service of Sierra Leone for the Year 1963/64**

[16th March, 1964.]

WHEREAS by the 1963/64 Appropriation Act, 1963 a sum not exceeding fifteen million, sixty-four thousand, six hundred and thirty-two pounds was provided for the service of Sierra Leone for the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three/sixty-four: Act No. 9
of 1963.

AND WHEREAS by the 1963/64 Supplementary Appropriation Act No. 30, 1963 a sum not exceeding three hundred and sixty-five thousand, three hundred and twelve pounds was provided for the service of Sierra Leone for the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three/sixty-four: of 1963.

AND WHEREAS by the 1963/64 Supplementary Appropriation (No. 2) Act, 1963 a sum not exceeding two hundred and eighty-six thousand, three hundred and seventy-eight pounds was provided for the service of Sierra Leone for the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three/sixty-four:

AND WHEREAS it has become necessary to provide for expenditure from the Consolidated Revenue Fund of a further sum of two hundred and ninety-eight thousand, six hundred and ninety-two pounds in excess of the provisions in the above cited Acts for the several services set forth in the First and Second Schedules hereto:

AND WHEREAS section 14 of the Finance (Control and Management) Act, 1961 provides that any proposals for such expenditure be submitted to a vote of the House by means of a Supplementary Appropriation Bill which shall contain that expenditure under appropriate Heads:

AND WHEREAS by virtue of the powers vested in him by Rule 2 of Part II of the Second Schedule to the Finance (Control and Management) Act, 1961, the Minister of Finance has by Warrant authorized the issue from the Contingencies Fund of the sums totalling eighty-seven thousand, six hundred and ninety-five pounds under the various Heads set out in the Second Schedule hereto, which expenditure could not without serious injury to the Public interest have been postponed until provision could be made by Supplementary Appropriation Act:

AND WHEREAS Rule 5 of Part II of the Second Schedule to the Finance (Control and Management) Act, 1961 provides that all withdrawals from the Contingencies Fund shall be reported to the House of Representatives at its next ensuing sitting so that that Fund shall be restored to the amount appropriated under section 18 of the said Act by inclusion of appropriations thereto in a Supplementary Appropriation Act:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the House of Representatives in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the 1963/64 Supplementary Appropriation (No 3) Act, 1964 and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 16th day of March, 1964.

2. The sum of two hundred and ninety-eight thousand, six hundred and ninety-two pounds shall be and is hereby granted to Her Majesty the Queen, Her Heirs and Successors for and during the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three/sixty-four to be applied for the several services set forth in the First and Second Schedules.

3. The said sum of two hundred and ninety-eight thousand, six hundred and ninety-two pounds shall be and is hereby declared to be charged upon and made payable from and out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the year nineteen hundred and sixty-three/sixty-four and the payment thereof shall be taken to begin immediately after the commencement of this Act:

Provided that in the case of the sums authorized by the Minister of Finance to be issued from the Contingencies Fund the payment thereof shall be taken to begin on the date of the Warrant authorizing such payment.

4. The Accountant-General is hereby authorized and required from time to time during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March nineteen hundred and sixty-four, upon the warrant or order of the Minister of Finance to pay out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund—

(a) the sum of two hundred and ten thousand, nine hundred and ninety-seven pounds for the services specified in the First Schedule; and

(b) the amount of eighty-seven thousand, six hundred and ninety-five pounds already paid into the Consolidated Revenue Fund from the Contingencies Fund under Warrants issued by the Minister of Finance under the provision of Rule 2 of the Contingencies Fund Rules, 1961, for the services specified in the Second Schedule.

5. The Accountant-General is also hereby authorized and required upon the Warrant or order of the Minister of Finance to pay from the Consolidated Revenue Fund into the Contingencies Fund the sum of eighty-seven thousand, six hundred and ninety-five pounds, in re-imbusement of the sums withdrawn from the Contingencies Fund for the services set out in the Second Schedule.

6. The amount from time to time paid for and in respect of the expenditure authorized in section 2 shall not exceed in gross that sum of two hundred and ninety-eight thousand, six hundred and ninety-two pounds, during the year ending on the thirty-first day of March nineteen hundred and sixty-four, and any balances remaining unissued at the end of March, nineteen hundred and sixty-four, shall lapse and shall not be available for making payments in the following year.
